# Political Party Project:



#### **Assignment:**

Working in groups of 3 to 4 students, create your own political party using information gathered from a variety
of sources. Your party must resemble a real political party. You must nominate a party leader, and delegate
positions within the party for each member of your group. You will be required to participate in a mock leaders'
debate on key issues, and you will also create a presentation about your party for the class.

## Your project must include the following:

- Create a party slogan.
- Design a party logo.
- Determine and explain where your party fits on the political spectrum. This will influence your party's point of view. Who are you trying to attract? Who are your target voters?
- Create a platform of key issues that your party wants to address if elected.
- Nominate a party leader/spokesperson, campaign leader and campaign strategist.
- Devise a campaign strategy: how will you get your message out to potential voters? (social media, posters, commercials, radio interviews, photo-ops etc.)

### **Presentations:**

- Radio Interview: create a short mock radio interview (approximately 2 minutes) where your party addresses
  one key political issue. You can record the interview with a smart phone or any other device of your choice. This
  is an audio interview only. Each party's interview will be played for the class, at which point the other parties
  will take notes to use in preparation for the Leaders Debate. Each party should pay attention to their
  opponents' stance on the assigned issue in order to strategize for the debate.
- Leaders' Debate: Your party leader will participate in a multiparty political debate on key issues that have been pre-determined. All party members must help with the preparation for the debate but only the party leader will take part in the debate.
- Each party will be given the same debate topics in advance in order to prepare.
- **Final Presentation:** Choose from one of the following options:
- A PowerPoint presentation describing your party, position on the political spectrum and party platform.
- A promotional video about your party addressing the criteria listed above.
- A poster addressing the criteria listed above.

#### **Evaluation:**

- Provide a breakdown of the work that your group did on the project (who did what).
- You will complete both a peer and self-evaluation for the project.
